Dear parents and guardians,

The Government of Canada has declared September 30th as the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation. The day is intended to recognize and honour residential school survivors, their families and their communities. It will also ensure that public commemoration of the tragic and painful history and legacy of residential schools remains a vital component of the reconciliation process. Please note that as this is a federal holiday, it only applies automatically to the federal government, federal crown boards and agencies and federally regulated companies.

However, during the regular board meeting held yesterday (September 16, 2021), the PRSD board of trustees voted that for the 2021-22 school year, *Thursday, Sept. 30 will be designated as a non-operational day in Peace River School Division* to demonstrate our commitment to the process of truth and reconciliation. *This means there will be no classes and schools will be closed for the day.*

Initially the board of trustees believed that having students in school on the National Day of Truth of Reconciliation would ensure that the importance of this day would be observed by all our students. However, upon learning that members of our community would value us honoring the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation by taking it as a day off school, we decided to explore this idea further. After consulting with various local Indigenous organizations, Elders and Knowledge keepers, we learned, and now agree, that our best way forward is that this day be observed in the same way as other national holidays.

The board also voted that September 27 to October 1, 2021 be declared Truth and Reconciliation Week in PRSD schools. By dedicating a full week to Truth and Reconciliation, schools will have the flexibility to select a minimum of one school day within the week to recognize Orange Shirt Day while students learn about the history and legacy of residential schools. Other learning activities that support Truth and Reconciliation will also be encouraged.

Please note that our school and divisional websites will be updated in the coming days to reflect this change.

Thank you for supporting this important initiative.

As per the Alberta Government's announcement on September 15, 2021 regarding newly mandated restrictions, this document has been updated with new information outlined in bold.

The Peace River School Division (PRSD) is committed to ensuring the safety and well-being of our students, and we thank our students, parents, staff and school communities for their patience and support as we start the new school year. Continuing learning will require everyone in the PRSD to continue to be nimble in contributing to the safety and success of our school communities.

All parents are required to screen their child for symptoms each day prior to their child attending school by using the <u>Alberta Health Daily Checklist</u>. Staff, parents and visitors are also required to screen for symptoms before attending any PRSD school or facility by using the Alberta Health Daily Checklist. If you or your child(ren) are not feeling well, please do not attend the school or PRSD facility.

Please be aware that the Peace River School Division will follow the guidance of Alberta Health Services (AHS) and the Alberta Education School Re-entry Plan. View the 2021-2022 Alberta Education School Year Plan here. The plan, along with other helpful COVID-19 Response information is posted on our website at prsd.ab.ca under "COVID-19 Response."

Should the nature of the pandemic change, PRSD will follow guidance from Alberta Health Services and Alberta Education. Alberta Education has developed contingency plans for schools to follow should things change and these plans are outlined in the <u>Alberta Education 2021-2022 School Year Plan</u>. Please note that any changes will be communicated to parents in a timely manner. Thank you again for your support, patience and understanding.

Cleaning and disinfecting procedures

- PRSD schools will continue to maintain enhanced cleaning measures.
- Additional disinfecting and cleaning measures will be implemented if there are elevated student and staff absences.
- PRSD will continue to work with students and staff to promote ongoing hand hygiene and respiratory etiquette.

Masks

- Masks are mandatory for all students in grades 4-12.
- Masks are mandatory for all staff in the school.
- Masks are mandatory for all visitors to the school.

Physical Distancing

• Physical distancing measures will be followed in all common areas.

Parent and visitor access to schools

- Masks are mandatory for all visitors to the school.
- Parents and visitors must make prior arrangements before attending the school.
- All parents and visitors to the school must screen for symptoms as per the <u>Alberta Health Daily Checklist</u> prior to attending the school, and must follow the school's sign-in procedures.

Diploma Exams

• The administration of Diploma Exams will resume and be mandatory as per normal practice.

Isolation and quarantine

- Individuals who test positive for COVID-19 are required by AHS to isolate for 10 days from when their symptoms started, or until their symptoms have improved, whichever is longer.
- AHS is no longer identifying or following up with individual close contacts, and quarantine for close contacts is no longer required.
- All Albertans, including those who may be told that they are close contact, are asked to monitor for symptoms and stay home and get tested if they are feeling unwell.
- AHS will continue to manage outbreaks of respiratory illnesses in school settings, similar to the management of influenza or influenza-like illness.

FIVE TIPS FOR SURVIVING MODULAR-BASED COURSES

"Live, learn and prosper!" This is not the Vulcan greeting but it could well be the instruction that leads to success for any enterprising individual.

Be organized

Because your learning is not structured like in a classroom, it is easy to procrastinate. Learning on your own requires discipline. Look through your materials and find ways to break the learning into small, defined pieces. Then set deadlines for yourself and schedule in the learning as a regular commitment. Use a calendar or organizer to plan specific learning times and activities.

Find a learning space

You might be able to learn at work or home if you can manage your interruptions and distractions. Let everyone know when you are learning. You may have to close a door, turn off the stereo and television or not answer the phone. You may find that going to a library is necessary. Once you have a good learning space, have all your learning materials together and organized. If your learning needs to be portable, put all your materials and supplies into a case or bag. It is easy to waste lots of time looking for things. (This is especially true if you have kids. In our house things like erasers, pencils, paper and pens are constantly disappearing. We have had to declare our office supplies as off limits.)

Read to learn

To make the best use of your materials, look them over before you start reading. Find ways to help you organize and summarize the information. Keep yourself focused when reading by looking for main ideas and taking notes. Stop reading often and ask yourself, "What did I just read? What was the main idea?" This self-testing will help you avoid the daydreaming and lack of focus that can come with reading.

Find support for learning

If someone is aware of your learning goals and commitments, they can help you succeed. If you are taking a formal course, you may have tutoring support available through the phone or the Internet. Some learners find it helpful to link up with another person who is taking the same course. They can then study together or support each other.

Support can take many forms including explaining subject material, encouraging, gently reminding you to get at it or helping with other roles such as covering workload, watching kids, making dinner or other acts that provide you with time and space for learning.

Follow through

If you find that your learning time is getting bumped from your schedule, consider other ways to manage your time and roles. You may have to negotiate with your employer, family or friend to help you make time for learning. Keep in mind your initial motivation, remind yourself why you are taking the course and how it will help you to succeed.

Keep these tips in mind to ace your next correspondence course.
